Are we creating brilliant minds without moral compasses?

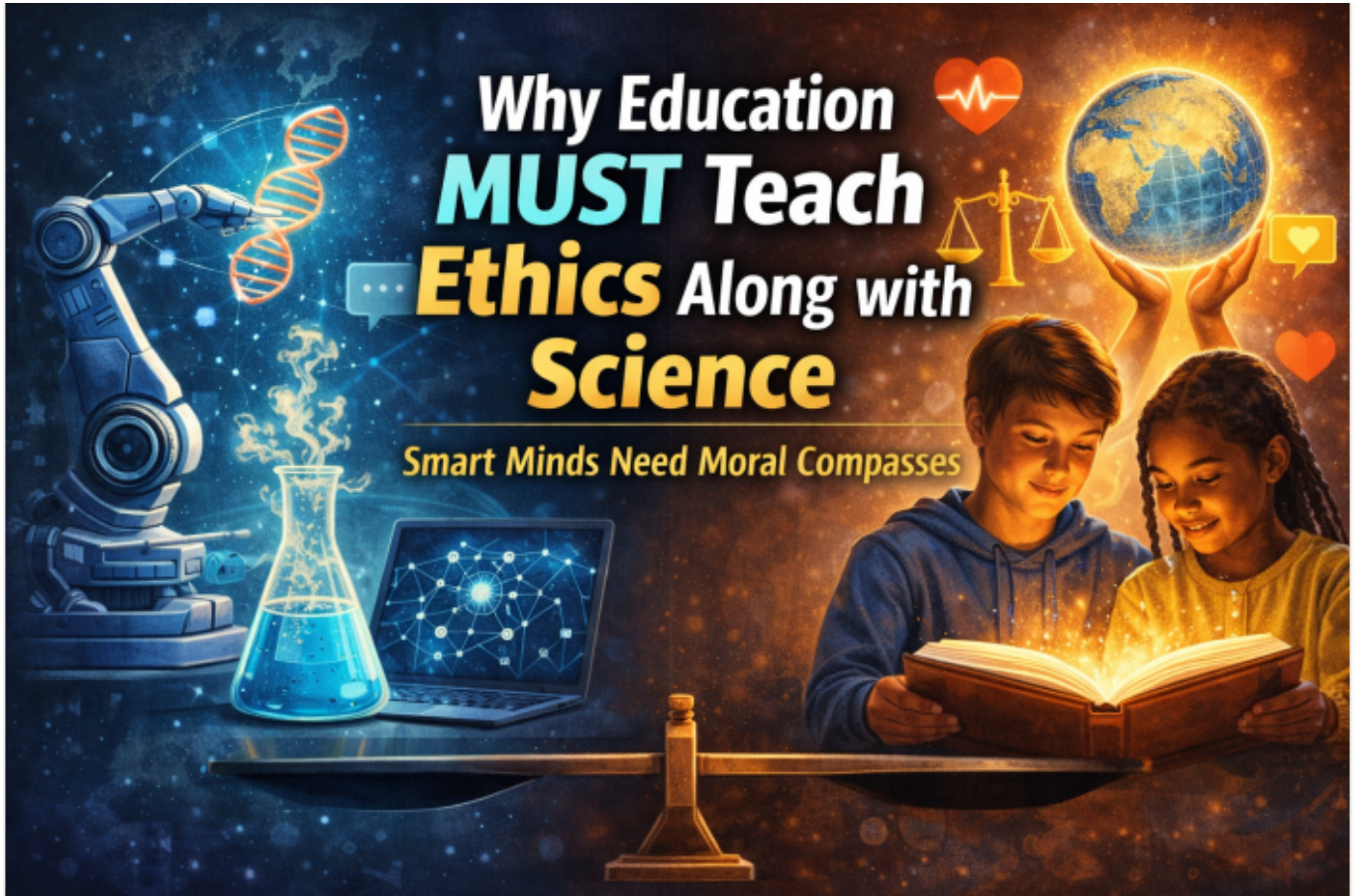
Science gives power.
