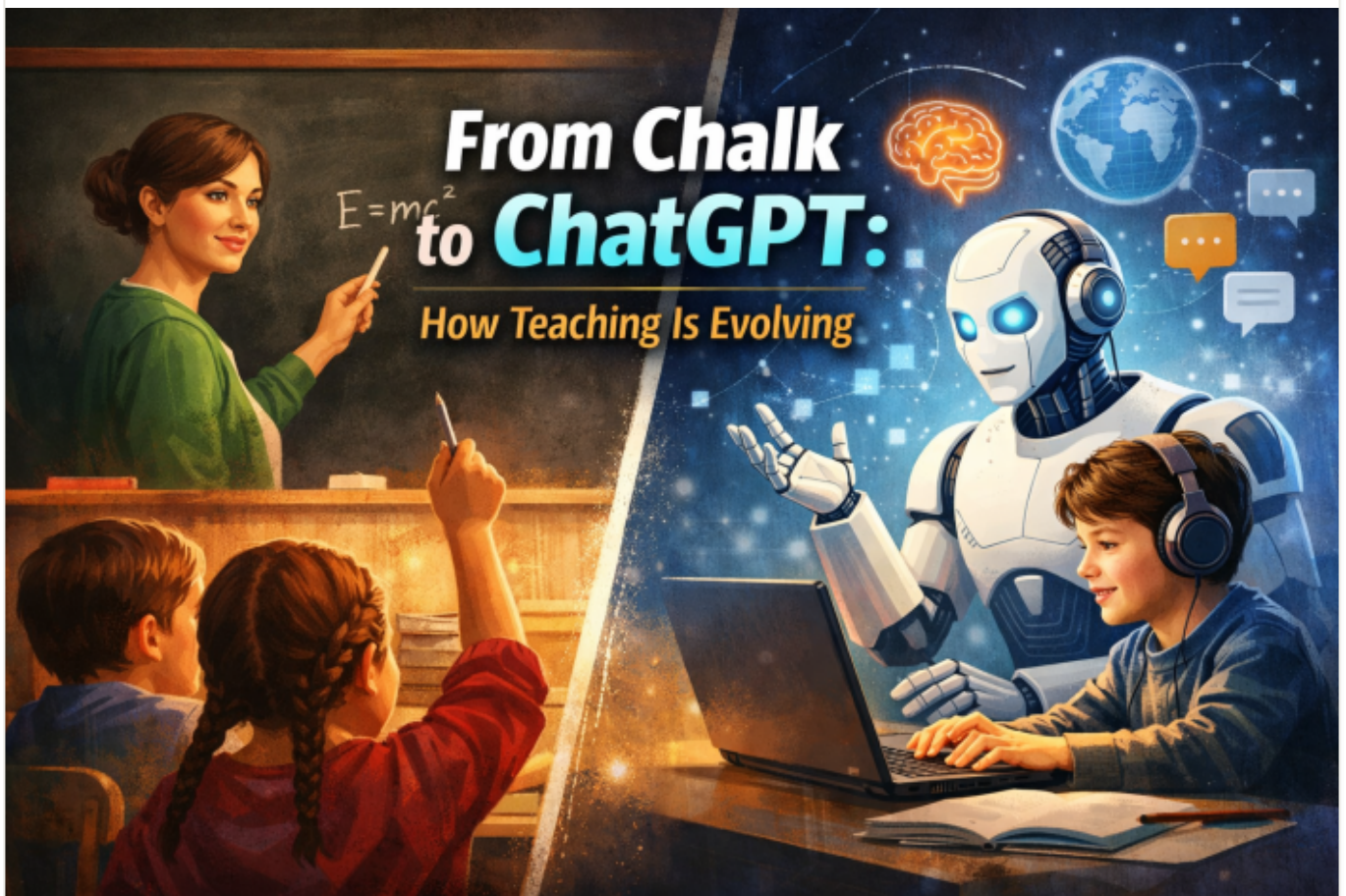
The Era of Chalk and Talk
